Objectives and activities

The charity's objects

To advance the arts, in particular film and associated arts for the benefit of the public, in particular but not exclusively by supporting the Hyde Park Picture House as part of the Leeds Grand Theatre and

- promoting, supporting and participating in the cultural landscape of Hyde Park, Leeds and Yorkshire, particularly through an appreciation and understanding of the art of cinema
- celebrating the heritage of the Hyde Park Picture House and ensuring its preservation and continued use for cinema and related arts.

The charity's main activities

There have been three members' events during the year:

- The Annual General Meeting with social and screening, Sunday 21st May -The Edge of The World (1937)
- -Yorkshire Day Event with social and screening, Sunday 30th July A double bill of The Battle of Orgreave (2002) and The Battle for Orgreave (1985)
- -The Christmas Event with social and screening, Thursday 14th December Fargo (1996).

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of the arts and particularly film.

Achievements and performance

In addition to organising the Annual General Meeting on the 22nd May 2016 the Yorkshire Day screening and the Christmas seasonal screening events for members the Committee has met on four occasions (15/5/17, 17/7/17, 16/10/17, 19/3/17): In addition the committee has:-

- * Engaged with the Picture House management and their consultants in the ongoing feasibility study which has culminated in the successful award of stage 1 funding of a Heritage Lottery Grant of £2.4m which was approved on 12 August 2016. It was agreed at the AGM on the 21st May 2017 that the Friends would continue to commit to the support of the ongoing development of the Picture House project and a pledge of £25,000 towards the overall funding costs was made. The timing of this cash payment is likley to be during 2018 and is capable of being made whilst still leaving the organisation with sufficient ongoing cash resources.
- * Continued to work on the development of their own independent website with the intention of supporting the activities of the Friends and the Picture House as well as engaging a wider audience in film culture. The website can be found here:

* Commenced initiatives aimed at increasing the Friends membership base through enhanced promotion and awareness of the organisation in the local community.

Basis of accounting
