Method of recruitment and appointment of trustees

The trustees of the charity are appointed by the members at the AGM. In addition the Leeds Grand Theatre & Opera House Limited appoints a representative as trustee. The current representative is Wendy Cook.

### Trustees' report (continued) for the year ended 5 April 2022

#### Objectives and activities

#### The charity's objects

To advance the arts, in particular film and associated arts for the benefit of the public, in particular but not exclusively by supporting the Hyde Park Picture House as part of the Leeds Grand Theatre and Opera House Ltd by such means as the trustees think fit including by:

Promoting, supporting and participating in the cultural landscape of Hyde Park, Leeds and Yorkshire, particularly through an appreciation and understanding of the art of cinema.

Celebrating the heritage of the Hyde Park Picture House and ensuring its preservation and continued use for cinema and related arts.

### The charity's main activities

Due to the Covid 19 Global Pandemic there have been limited formal events limited to:-

- the Annual General Meeting held as a digital event via Zoom on 31 January 2022
- A Special General Meeting was held on 21 February 2022 to follow up on various actions from the AGM and to pass measures as was required following the AGM not being quorate

#### **Public benefit statement**

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of the arts and particularly film.

### Achievements and performance

Due to the Covid 19 Global Pandemic and also due to the closure of the Hyde Park Picture House Cinema for a planned redevelopment project, the usual events including specific member events have not been undertaken during the year.

Despite the cinema closure and the inability to meet in person, the committee has continued to operate as normally as possible during the year via online Zoom meetings.

In addition to organising the Annual General Meeting on 31 January 2022 and the Special General Meeting on 21 February 2022 the Committee has met on nine occasions (29 March, 26 April, 7 June, 5 July, 9 August, 13 September and 11 October 2021, 10 January and 21 March 2022).

Included within the meetings listed above was a Friends Forum held on 29 March 2021. The purpose of this forum was to engage with the wider Friends membership base around certain changes which are to be undertaken to the Friends membership scheme in conjunction with ongoing discussions with the Hyde Park Picture House Cinema.

For many years one of the primary benefits of Friends membership has been a discounted rate at the cinema box office. When the cinema re-opens after the redevelopment project it will put in place its own membership scheme aimed at attracting the widest audience possible. As a result of this, the Friends membership scheme will change, and it is likely that the role of the organisation will also change. It is intended that the Friends organisation will continue to work very closely with the cinema whilst moving towards more specific volunteering based projects, which both support the cinema and which are in line with the aims and objectives of the Friends organisation.

During the year the Friends continued to work on the development of their own independent website with the intention of supporting the activities of the Friends and the Picture House as well as engaging a wider audience in film cuture. The website can be found here: https://friendsofhpph.org/

#### **Financial review**

The net payments for the year were £603, all relating to unrestricted funds.

### Reserves policy

The charity's free reserves at the year end were £22,842.

The trustees have decided to adopt a lower limit and an upper limit for the amount of cash reserves within the organisation. In setting the lower limit the trustees have considered the level of expenses which may be required to a cover a period of 12 months without any income and the costs of an orderly wind up of the charity should that be required.

In setting the upper limit, the trustees have considered the maximum amount of cash reserves that it should hold. The policy is in place to prevent the cash reserves of the charity accumulating over time to the point where the Charity could be considered to not be deploying its cash reserves appropriately to meet it's charitable objectives.
